They carried out biological field study work, investigating living things in various habitats and classifying them using keys. They also learnt lots of really fascinating information about the changes to our wildlife as a result of human development and climate change.

There was a really tangible positive vibe around the whole school, as classes took turns to do their circuits in the hall. I thought it would be a brilliant way to start every week - that would really waken us all up and have us alert for learning for the rest of the week. This morning is our last brilliant KS1 gymnastics enrichment session. The KS1 children have really enjoyed it.


The Scholastic Book Fair has been in the hall each day straight after school. The last day to visit is Monday - up to 3:30pm.

#### **Behaviour at Bearwood**

This is our third feature explaining how we manage behaviour at Bearwood. This week, we will share some of the consequences that we select to implement and how they work.

The purpose of the consequences we use is to help children to learn and make pro-social choices. They are not selected or implemented to be 'punishments' in the traditional way. Each consequence is selected according to the child's specific needs.


One possible consequence is for a child to sit by themself in the classroom. The purpose is to help the child to concentrate on their learning, and not distract other children. This consequence is usually for a short period of time, enables the child to also reflect, and enables the child to rejoin the class.

Another consequence is to spend time in another classroom. The purpose of this consequence is the same as the previous one. A child may still not be able to focus if they are in their own classroom, so having some time in another classroom may better support them. This consequence could also be implemented for a short time for a child who finds a particular lesson challenging, whilst we find other effective ways to enable to child to join in the lesson with their class.

For a child who may find playtimes particularly challenging, we may reduce their playtime or even replace it with an alternative activity such as completing a task or job. Again, this will be while we tried to address whatever difficulty the child was having with engaging in playtimes. This could be developing the child's social skills.

Another consequence we use is the restorative conversation. This usually follows an altercation. The children involved are guided in a structured restorative conversation. It enables each party to say how they felt or why they responded as they did. It helps to develop the children's emotional intelligence. The children agree to how damage to the relationship can be repaired to the satisfaction of all parties.

From our own internal data, we have found that the approaches we are taking has had a positive impact, with a reduction to the number of anti-social behaviour incidents being reported.









**Science Week** has been a success! We have been so impressed with all the children that took part in experiments at home.

Also, a huge thank you to our Parent volunteers who have held an assembly this week.

Miss Marquis who on Wednesday encaptivated the LKS2 children, talking about her incredible job in STEM working with robots!

Mr Juna who on Thursday held an assembly on electricity including looking at oscilloscopes.

The children have been really enjoyed becoming scientists this week.

# Are you entitled?

Free school meals and extra funding for your child's education Across the UK more than 10 per cent of pupils who are eligible for free school meals do not register to get them.

We want to make sure 100 per cent of our pupils claim when they can in Wokingham Borough.

Importantly, it also means schools can get additional funding to support pupils.

To qualify, your child must be in school and you must be receiving one of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based <u>Job Seekers Allowance</u>
- Income related <u>Employment and Support Allowance</u>
- NASS support
- Guarantee element of <u>State Pension</u>
- Child Tax Credit, provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit for the four weeks after employment ends
- <u>Universal Credit</u>, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400

If this applies to you but your child isn't registered for free school meals, complete a form and return it to your child school.


