Reading

- It is expected that children will read daily at home. When children have completed their book they will complete a quiz on accelerated reader in school.
- Accelerated reader will test if the child has read the book and check their comprehension (understanding). This replaces the need to read to a teacher before they can change their book.
- Children who read 20mins+ per day make better progress academically.
- Reading to your child at home is also beneficial.



Spelling

- Whilst there are 108 words for children to learn to spell on the Y3/4 spelling list, in school we will focus on the rules, not the individual words.
- This enables pupils to apply these rules when spelling a range of words.
- E.g. -able/-ible

If the root word can stand alone, it is probably -able: collectable. If it can't, it is probably -ible: edible

- Children can practise set spelling words on the Spelling Shed website as well as playing spelling games.
- Choose 5 words a week from the spelling list to practise
- We want to see children use the spellings within their writing

Maths-Times tables

- There is a focus on multiplication tables this year, as there will be a statutory test for the Year 4 children.
- By the end of Year 3, children are expected to know the facts for the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables, with corresponding division facts.
- By the end of Year 4, children are expected to know all multiplication facts up to 12 x 12, and their related division facts.
- Practising daily will reduce the pressure before the test.
- This year we are teaching maths in mixed classes Year 3/4.
