Our children have continued to be very focused on their learning whilst in their classes. 
Next week Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March is World Book Day. We look forward to seeing the children dressed up as a favourite book character. The staff will be dressed up too!

#### Behaviour at Bearwood

You may recall that last year we introduced a new approach to behaviour management, as part of our new 'Therapeutic Thinking Behaviour Policy'.

The purpose of the policy is to promote the positive and develop good character; supporting our children to consistently show behaviour that prioritises positive experiences and feelings. Where children may find this challenging, we have a clear structure of support to develop their internal discipline. We believe this approach will enable us to meet our ultimate vision:

We aspire to be an outstanding, values-based school at the heart of our diverse community.

Striving for excellence, our focus is to enable our children to be resilient and independent learners whilst also considerate of others.

Through an all-encompassing curriculum, our children will achieve their highest potential and have a firm foundation on which to build successful and productive lives in an ever-changing world.

The therapeutic thinking approach has been strongly advocated by Wokingham LA, who have committed themselves to investing in training leaders in all their schools. Funmi Alder, Caroline Parry and Kayleigh Haden have all completed the three full days of training, delivered by a highly regarded national consultant. In turn, we have delivered three professional development sessions on the approach to our staff. Caroline Parry leads on behaviour at Bearwood, and has overall responsibility for ensuring the policy is implemented.

# Are you entitled?

Free school meals and extra funding for your child's education Across the UK more than 10 per cent of pupils who are eligible for free school meals do not register to get them.

We want to make sure 100 per cent of our pupils claim when they can in Wokingham Borough.

Importantly, it also means schools can get additional funding to support pupils.

To qualify, your child must be in school and you must be receiving one of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based <u>Job Seekers Allowance</u>
- Income related <u>Employment and Support Allowance</u>
- NASS support
- Guarantee element of <u>State Pension</u>
- Child Tax Credit, provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit for the four weeks after employment ends
- <u>Universal Credit</u>, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400

If this applies to you but your child isn't registered for free school meals, complete a form and return it to your child school.

# The Wokingham North Neighbourhood Policing Team will mark and register your bikes for free!




